

## *Annual Report- 2010*

This year AAMF started its journey with some new establishment, new ideas with some new exciting activities. Starting its inception in 1999, AAMF managed NFE centers and in 2009 it introduced feeding center (kitchen) for poor people. AAMF also distributed nutritious food to expectant mothers at Kusumpur Pahari for one year. This year AAMF expanded its activities with a new Project- Free English Class (FEC)

### **Non Formal Education-**

Nearly 1500 children between the ages 8 to 17 are registered with AAMF. This year we have started new NFE centers at the following locations.

- 2- Sultanpuri # 1,2,3
- 3- Govindpuri
- 4- Kakrola Gaon

- 6- Molarband

### ***Activities for Children***

#### **Educational Trip-**

The most enjoyable moment for the students is spending time with our nature and knowing the history of nature and mankind. We organized field trips throughout the year to National Museum, National Museum of Natural History, Parliament Museum, Nature trail and Mughal garden at President Estate. Children enjoyed the flora and fauna of the garden in the President house. We organized the field trips in groups.

The National Bal Bhavan observed Education for All (EPA) week from 28 to 30 April 2010. The program was for children belonging to the deprived section of society and Delhi schools. As a member of NBB we had received an invitation for participation (10 children of the age group 10-16). They organized workshops on essay writing, story and poem writing and extempore speech. They also organized the competitions on Poster making, collage making, clay modeling and craft making.

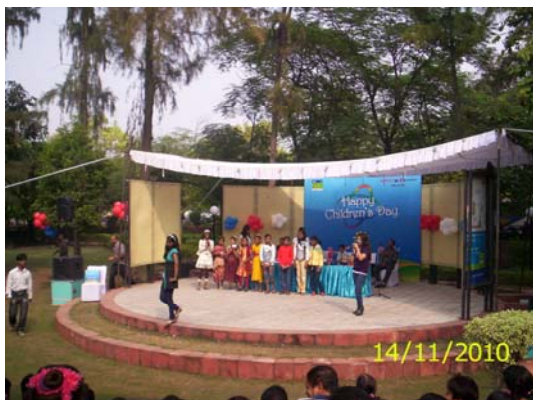
Ten students from Subhash Camp participated in these workshops and various competitions. The students also took part in activities like wood craft, weaving,

book binding, stichery, paper folding and handicraft in the afternoon. The participants received certificates at the end of the programme.



**Celebrating children's day-** On the occasion of Children's Day, Maruti company had organized a program at Children's park, India Gate on Sunday, 14 November 10. They have invited AAMF children to join the programme. Four staff members and sixty children from Mohan Garden, Kakrola and Viswash Park visited Children's Park on 14 November 2010. They participated in different competitions like Role play, drawing, painting, singing, dancing and quiz etc. They performed a role play on the stage. The name of role play was *21st Century ka Raskhash –Plastic*. The organiser also arranged magic shows, tattoos and other attractions.

At the end of the show they distributed gifts and snacks to all the children.



**Activities in the educational centers-**AAMF organized activities like celebrating the festivals, seasons, Independence day, Republic day etc. These include drawings, craft in waste material, dramatizing, story telling and speeches.

Community Services - AAMF believes that education means overall growth of students which does not confined to classroom. Keeping in mind AAMF have introduced community Service programme in all educational centers. This programme is going on every Friday at 11.00 AM (morning session) and 3.00 PM (afternoon Session) .Students remove the trash surrounding their center and adjoining area. This is an awareness program that coordinated by the students and teachers that have set an example to inspire and motivate others.

The initiatives have received mixed response while some parents praised and few parents criticized the program. Despite objections by parents at some places, teachers are organizing it regularly. They exclude those children, whose parents are objecting.



### **Teachers' training-**

Teachers hold very important role in AAMF. They facilitate knowledge and guide learners (children) to achieve better accomplishments. Therefore it is important to arrange training/orientation program for the teachers to update their skills and equip them with latest developments. Our monthly meeting of the teachers is periodic in service education for the teachers. In these meeting we discuss curriculum, latest education techniques. The teachers share their experiences and give presentation on different topics. Our education advisors also provide necessary guidance to the teachers to update their skill. In the year 2010 12 teachers meetings were organized in AAMF on 9 January, 6 February, 6 March, 3 April, 1 May, 3 July , 7 August, 2 September, 3 October, 6 November and 4 December 2010.



**English Coach-** AAMF also takes care of educators to improve their English language. AAMF has hired a qualified English coach and she takes a three hours class in every Saturdays. She teaches grammar, composition, comprehensions, question answer sessions etc.

**Supervisors** – AAMF choose two best educators and promote them as supervisors. They visit all the centers independently. They assist the teachers to improve the class and supervise the class regularly. They are especially helpful for new teachers. The supervisors took demonstration classes and advised the new teachers to follow their method. They advised the teachers to maintain hygiene while distributing food and teach the children better table manners.

**Free English Class (FEC)** - AAMF has introduced FEC class at Vasant Gaon office. This is a computer based English learning. The objective of the class is to improve English through software. People can improve language skill easily through this medium.

We have extended this facility to all the employees as well as non employees free of cost. Each FEC helps to study English grammar and vocabulary. Free lesson plans focus on building conversational skills. These lessons are meant for the beginners as well as for those in the advanced level. It is also open to all the youngsters, employees as well as non employees. The FEC classes are going on from morning 6AM to 11 P.M. We have planned to start new FECs in other parts of Delhi.



### **Feeding Center-**

AAMF feeding centers aims to provide food to poorest of the poor everyday. AAMF feeds over 400 people in different slums/villages in Delhi. AAMF has 5 feeding centers which serve food to children, old and who have little or no food to sustain themselves. We provide nutritious and high quantity food consisting of hot meal consisting of rice, cereal and vegetable.

Following are the Kitchens we started this year:

### **Program for expectant mothers**

Twelve ladies had availed food for one year which continued up to 6 months after the birth of baby.

### **Volunteer Program-**

Mr. Ravi Shrivastav wanted with AAMF as a volunteer for one month. After 25 years of service as an auditor in the Ministry of Tourism, Mr. Shrivastav took voluntary retirement and has been devoting much of his time towards spiritualism

and meditation. He spent one month (every Wednesdays and Fridays) with the children of Ambedkar camp and taught the children moral values/good habits through telling stories.

AAMF organized meetings with Swechha, an NGO working towards making volunteering a mainstream activity for young people. They sent us the following volunteers.
